Founded in 1878, UdeM today has close to 70,000 students, 2,300 professors and researchers, and an active global network of 450,000 alumni. Its long list of illustrious graduates includes: former Canadian Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau; Louise Arbour, former Chief Prosecutor of the International Criminal Tribunals for the former Yugoslavia and Rwanda; astrophysicist Hubert Reeves; authors Antonine Maillet and Kim Thù; filmmakers Denys Arcand and Jean-Marc Vallée; and Roger Guillemin, co-winner of the 1977 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine.

Deeply rooted in Montreal and dedicated to its international mission, Université de Montréal is a leading research university.

With its affiliated schools, Polytechnique Montréal and HEC Montréal, UdeM is Quebec's biggest university complex and one of the largest in North America. Among French-language universities it ranks 6th, and among all universities 111th, according to Times Higher Education, placing it in the first percentile of the world's top institutions of higher learning.

UdeM attracts over \$500 million in research funding every year, making it one of Canada's top university research hubs.

UdeM is home to 145 Canada Research Chairs, 2 Canada Excellence Research Chair and one Canada 150 Research Chair, allocated to the preeminent scholars in their fields. Many renowned laboratories were founded at UdeM, including: Mila, the world's leading research centre for artificial intelligence; the Institute for Research in Immunology and Cancer (IRIC), one of the most dynamic in its field; and the Centre de recherche en droit public (CRDP), Canada's most comprehensive research centre in public law.

Among the university's illustrious alumni are astrophysicist Hubert Reeves; Joanne Liu, formerly international president of Doctors Without Borders; Roger Guillemin, co-winner of the 1977 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine; Oscar-winning filmmaker Denys Arcand and Oscar-nominated director Jean-Marc Vallée; Louise Arbour, former chief prosecutor of the International Criminal Tribunals for the former Yugoslavia and Rwanda; authors Antonine Maillet and Kim Thù; and the late Pierre Elliott Trudeau, one of Canada's best-known prime ministers. UdeM graduates are also part of a proud and active network of 450,000 alumni worldwide.

With its 13 faculties and two affiliated schools, has close to 70,000 students and 10,000 employees, including 2,300 professors and researchers. It offers more than 600 programs of study, including 350 at the graduate level. The range of disciplines studied on its campuses is one of the widest in Canada, fostering a variety of interdisciplinary studies. Close to half of its faculties are in the health sciences sector and the university is at the heart of a network of some 30 affiliated health institutions, including two university teaching hospitals, the CHUM and the CHU Sainte-Justine.

technological innovation. UdeM carries a designation as a Fair Trade Campus and in 2023 placed 60th in the QS World University sustainability rankings, which evaluate levels of social and environmental engagement at 700 universities around the globe.

Faculty of Environmental Design
